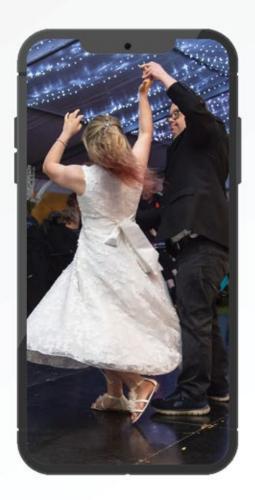

HOW TO APPLY FOR SIL

Supported Independent Living (SIL) is funded by the NDIS to help people with disability live independently while receiving 24/7 support. If you are looking for SIL support the steps below will guide you through the process of applying for SIL funding with the NDIS.

STEP 1: ELIGIBILITY

SIL funding is for participants who require 24/7 support. To be eligible, you must:

- Have significant functional impairments.
- Require daily assistance.
- Have a support need that aligns with SIL rather than other support models.
- Be assessed as needing ongoing and consistent support.

STEP 2: EVIDENCE

To support your request, you'll need detailed evidence from professionals, including:

- Allied health reports outlining why SIL is required.
- A Functional Capacity
 Assessment to demonstrate your level of support needs.
- A Support Needs Assessment explaining why 24/7 support is necessary.
- A Roster of Care (RoC) document to outline your required daily and weekly supports.

STEP 3: ROSTER OF CARE

A Roster of Care (RoC) is a key document used in the SIL funding process. It:

- Outlines the daily and weekly support needs required to live independently.
- Breaks down staff ratios.
- Helps the NDIS assess whether SIL is reasonable and necessary.
- Is usually completed by a SIL provider or allied health professional based on your current and future support needs.

STEP 4: EXPLORE OPTIONS

Before applying for SIL, you need to explore which housing and support model best suits your needs:

Shared SIL Accommodation: Living with other NDIS participants with 24/7 support.

Independent SIL: Receiving SIL support while living alone.

If SIL is not the right fit, you may consider Individual Living Options (ILO).

Not sure which is best? A Support Coordinator can help explore your options.

STEP 5: PLAN REVIEW OR NEW PLAN

Once you have gathered evidence, you can apply for SIL during:

- Your initial NDIS plan meeting.
- A plan review
- A Change of Circumstances request

How to present your case:

 Explain why SIL is essential for your safety, independence,

- and daily functioning.
- Show your evidence and Roster of Care to justify your funding request.
- Provide quotes from SIL providers to demonstrate service costs.

During your planning meeting, explain why SIL is essential to your independence.

STEP 6: NDIS ASSESSMENT AND APPROVAL

The NDIS will assess your SIL request based on the evidence provided and whether SIL is:

- Reasonable and necessary.
- The most suitable housing support option.
- · Cost-effective and sustainable.

If approved, SIL funding will be included in your Core Supports budget under Assistance with Daily Life support category.

If SIL is not approved, you can request an Internal Review and submit additional evidence or consider alternative support options such as ILO.

STEP 7: SECURE A SIL PROVIDER AND MOVE IN

After funding approval:

- Choose a SIL provider.
- Finalise a SIL service agreement.
- Transition into your supported living arrangement.

WHAT IS BOARDCONNECT?

Board Connect, allows Orana participants the opportunity to engage directly with members of the Board.

Participants can share their experiences, provide feedback on Orana's services, and contribute to meaningful improvements. This initiative ensures that participant voices are heard at the highest level, strengthening Orana's commitment to person-centred services.

WHY IS BOARDCONNECT IMPORTANT?

Genuine Participant

Engagement: Your lived experiences provide valuable insights that help Orana improve its services.

Board Awareness &

Understanding: Board members gain a deeper understanding of the needs, choices, and aspirations of the people Orana supports.

Service Improvements: Your feedback shapes future policies, programs, and service delivery.

HOW DO THE SESSIONS WORK?

When and Where?

Sessions are held from 4.30–5.30 pm on the 29th April or 28th October at Orana's Netley site.

One-on-One Discussions:

Each Board member will be paired with a participant for a direct conversation.

Based on preferences,

conversations may last the full hour or be divided into shorter interactions with multiple participants.

Voluntary Participation:

Participation in the BoardConnect program is optional. Participants will need to arrange their own support and transport if they want to attend a session.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF TAKING PART?

Make Your Voice Heard: Share your experiences and thoughts about Orana's services.

Drive Positive Change: Your feedback can directly influence service improvements.

Build Connections: Engage in meaningful discussions with Board members who want to understand your perspective.

Empowerment & Inclusion: Be part of a program that values participant voices at the decision-making level.

Meals on Wheels is dedicated to preparing and delivering wholesome meals to those in need across South Australia.

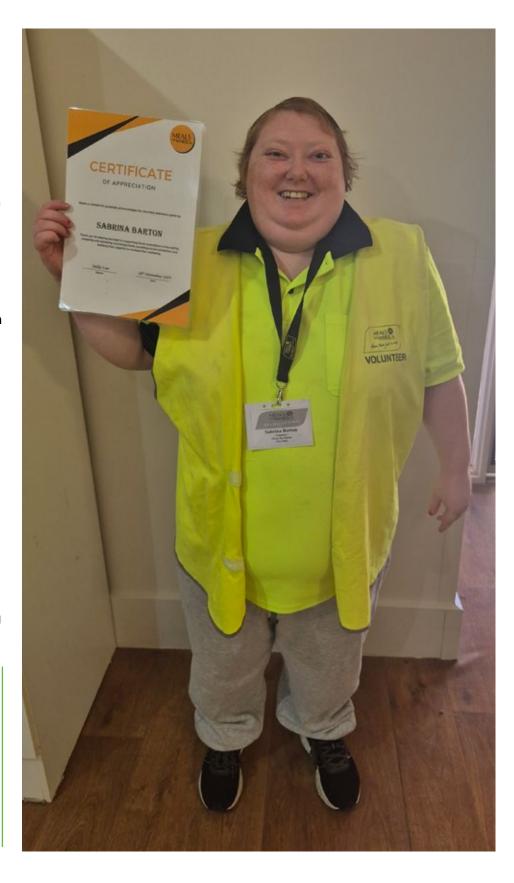

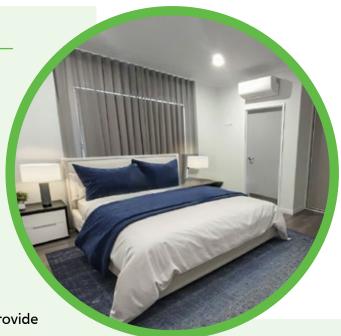

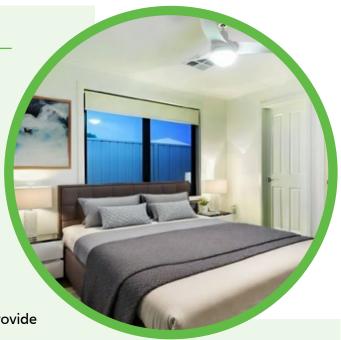
